Waccamaw RIVERKEEPER®'s Adopt-A-Landing Program Broke Records! The works of nearly 100 volunteers resulted in 10,000 pounds of discarded waste being picked up during our [Clean Up Our Local Waterways 2016](#) initiative and we are still not done!

The Waccamaw RIVERKEEPER®, iHeart Media, Conway Parks & Recreation, Coastal Carolina University's Faculty & Students, Ripley's Aquarium's Conservation Team, Gator Bait Adventure Tours, Black River Outdoors Center, Sierra Club's Winyah Group and a multitude of eager volunteers came together to help pick up litter, trash and flood debris.

Efforts this year were focused on the public landings along the Waccamaw River and surrounding wetlands most heavily hit by this Fall's flooding. Between J. Todd Landing & Cox Ferry almost 4,000 pounds of trash was

collected. Additionally, Keep Horry County Beautiful coordinated several community cleanups between 4/16- 4/22 with over 200 volunteers and 16,520 pounds of trash collected!

"This was my first time participating in a cleanup event, and while the amount of trash is disturbing, the enthusiasm and eagerness to improve the cleanliness of the river that the volunteers displayed is a testament to the heart of the people who love this river," said a local student from Coastal Carolina University.

"I want to thank all the volunteers and the folks from the Waccamaw RIVERKEEPER® Program who gave up their Saturday morning to come clean our backyard wetlands. We're still recovering from the flood and we're so thankful to you all," said Lynn Cox a local resident whose home flooded on three separate occasions this fall.

"Once again, the community came out to support this event and we were able to pick up a record amount of garbage and debris" said Emma Boyer, the Waccamaw Riverkeeper.

This has been a great initiative that truly demonstrates how community efforts matter in keeping our rivers swimmable, drinkable and fishable for our families and our future. We hope all our volunteers, Adopt-A-Landing adopters, program sponsors and the community will join us for one last cleanup and celebration, let's talk trash at the Trash Bash!

2001 to 2016...that's how long we've been educating and advocating to protect our local rivers and clean water.


And we've accomplished a lot, with the generous support of our members, donors, and volunteers:
