Protecting Clean Water

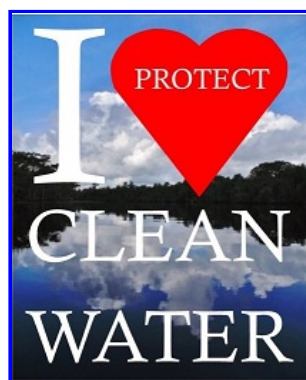
This year we celebrated our 15th anniversary. As 2016 ends, we're reflecting back on our successes and the support of people like you in helping

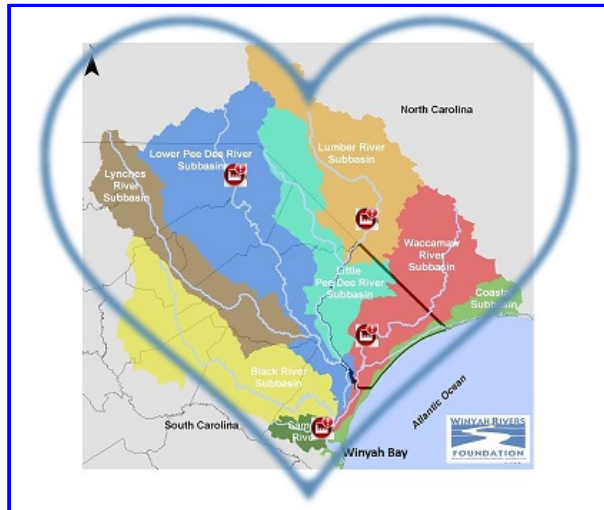

SC. Removal of the coal ash for reprocessing is underway.

We did the same with Duke Energy and got a commitment to remove the coal ash at the Weatherspoon site on the Lumber River.

We expect the same results at coal ash sites on the Pee Dee and Sampit Rivers. Only then will we be free of the longstanding water quality threats of coal ash dumps in our Winyah Bay watershed.
